## **Cults, Chemicals, and Adolescents**

- Examine the impact of chemical use on the adolescent satanic practitioner as it relates to noncriminal and criminal activity
- Apply appropriate prevention, intervention, and investigative measures
- Explain proactive vs. reactive approaches to cult group intervention
- Differentiate between levels of adolescent and adult involvement
- Explore case studies with indicators of Satanic activity
